### Need to strengthen laws to fight menace against illicit trade & smuggling: Ex-VP Naidu

Former Vice President M Venkaiah Naidu today said that it is imperative for all stakeholders to reform, perform and transform in order to end the menace of counterfeiting and smuggling. "There is a need to strengthen the existing laws. Unless all of us join together, the fight against illicit trade and smuggling cannot be won," he emphasised.

Addressing the 8th edition of FICCI-CASCADE 'MASCRADE 2022', Naidu asserted that sharing of ideas, experiences and sharing of views in formulating a more effective legislation with implementation is required to create awareness and industry to play a critical role in this. "Transformation of the system, society, governance,

is required for the happiness of the people and is required to create awareness among the consumers," he added.

Former Vice President also stated that it is imperative to protect the rights of the consumers. "Consumer awareness has to be taken as a mission with a passion for the sake of the nation and then the real change will come," said Naidu, adding, India is on the move and one of the fastest growing economies in the world and we must all join together to end the menace of counterfeiting and smuggling.

Sandeep Kumar, member, Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs said, "Due to technology advancements, the industry today has the opportunity to create tools that can empower consumers to take on smuggling and counterfeiting. This, along with strong

enforcement can make a big difference on the ground. The fight against illicit trade has to become a mass movement," Sanjiv Mehta, president, FICCI said. "Strong cooperation between different stakeholders and innovative action is required to free India of illicit trade. Smuggling and counterfeiting is all-pervasive and industry, government and society directly bear its brunt." He further added that the Consumer Protection Act is a stepping-stone towards empowering the consumers.

Anil Rajput, chairman, FICCI CASCADE said, "Smuggling is the deadliest form of illicit trade. Besides causing severe damage to the exchequer, in the form of loss of revenue, proliferating terrorism by allowing terror groups to get funds, and impacting consumer health and safety, it also leads to large scale unemployment by export-

ing jobs out of the country."

During the event, FICCI CASCADE-TARI report 'Illicit Markets: A Threat to Our National Interests' was released. The study examines the size and scale of illicit markets in five key Indian industries and assesses its impact on individual industries, employment, government tax collection, and the overall economy.

According to the study, the illicit market in 5 Key Indian industries, including mobile phones, FMCG-household and personal goods, FMCG-packaged foods, tobacco products, and alcoholic beverages is valued at Rs 2,60,094 crore. The combined FMCG industry — household and personal goods, and packaged foods — accounts for 3/4th of the total illicit value of goods in these industries. The study finds that illicit trade leads to an estimated legitimate

employment loss of 15.96 lakh, with the combined FMCG industry accounting for about 68.5% of job losses.

The estimated tax loss to the government due to illicit goods in these industries is Rs 58,521 crore, with two highly regulated and taxed industries, tobacco products, and alcoholic beverages, accounting for nearly 49% of the overall tax loss.

In terms of the percentage of the illicit market, the FMCG-household and personal goods industry is ahead of the other four sectors at 34.25%. This means that out of every 100 household and personal goods, nearly 34 were traded illegally. The sector is followed by FMCG-packaged foods industry at 25.09%, tobacco products industry at 20.04%, alcoholic beverages industry at 19.87%, and mobile phones industry at 7.56%.

The Indian exchequer is estimated to have lost ₹58,521 crore in taxes in 2019-20 due to illicit trade in goods in five key industries — mobile-phones, household and personal goods, packaged food, tobacco products and alcoholic beverages — according to report released by FICCI on Thursday.

The report estimates the size of illicit market in these sectors at over ₹2.60-lakh crore for 2019-20. “The impact of the illicit market of these key industries on the economy is pervasive and significant because of the backward linkages of these industries with other sectors of the economy, resulting in a multiplier effect. Higher the multiplier, higher is its overall effect on the economy,” said the report.

## ₹58k cr lost in taxes due to Illicit trade

**Unlawful market valued at ₹2.60 tn in FY20, says Ficci**

**THE ILLICIT MARKET** across five Indian key industries, including mobile phones and alcoholic beverages, was valued at ₹2.6 trillion in 2019-20, with the FMCG segment accounting for three-fourth of the total value, according to a report by industry body Ficci.

There was an estimated tax loss of ₹58,521 crore to the government from the five sectors — others being FMCG — household and personal goods, FMCG — packaged foods, and tobacco products. The unlawful trade in these sectors resulted in an estimated legitimate employment loss of 1.59 million, the report by Ficci's Committee Against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy's (CASCADE) said.

The FMCG industry (household and personal goods, and packaged foods) accounted for legitimate job losses of 1.09 million, which is about 68.5% of total job losses across the five industries. This is because the sector is more labour-intensive, with a relatively higher illicit market size.

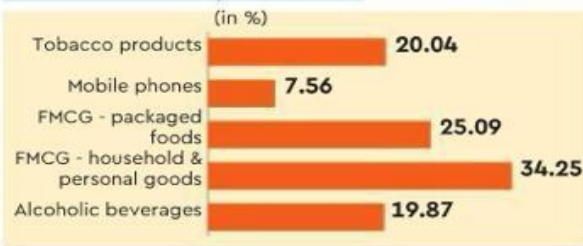
According to the report, 'Illicit Markets: A Threat to Our National Interests', two highly regulated and taxed industries, tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, accounted for nearly 49% of the overall tax loss to the government.

the economy is "pervasive and significant" due to their backward linkages with other sectors, resulting in a multiplier effect, it said. The multiplier effect measures the total impact on the economy per unit change (gain or loss) in demand of the industry. Higher the multiplier, higher is its overall effect on the economy, it said.

The FMCG — packaged foods industry had the highest share of the illicit market at ₹1.42 trillion, followed by the FMCG — household and personal goods industry at ₹55,530 crore, alcoholic beverages at ₹23,466 crore, tobacco products at ₹22,930 crore, and mobile phone industry at ₹15,884 crore.

In percentage terms, the household and personal goods industry topped the chart with 34.25%, followed by packaged foods at 25.09%, tobacco products industry at 20.04%, alcoholic beverages industry at 19.87%, and mobile phone

industry at 7.56%.

While 0.79 million jobs — the maximum — were lost in the FMCG — packaged foods industry, the tobacco industry followed with 0.37 million jobs, FMCG household and personal goods with 0.29 million, alcoholic beverages industry with 97,900, and the mobile phone industry with 35,000 jobs lost.

The tax loss to the government due to illicit trade in these five sectors stood at ₹17,074 crore from FMCG packaged foods, ₹15,262 crore (alcoholic beverages), ₹13,331 crore (tobacco products), ₹9,995 crore (FMCG household and personal goods), and ₹2,859 crore (mobile phones).

The report said the illicit market for tobacco products has increased from ₹21,811 crore in 2018-19 to ₹22,930 crore in 2019-20. The market percentage has also increased from 19.88% in 2018-19 to 20.04% in 2019-20.



# Govt lost ₹58,521 crore in taxes due to illicit goods in 5 industries

THE estimated tax loss to the government due to illicit goods in five industries -- mobile phones, FMCG-household and personal goods, FMCG-packaged foods, tobacco products and alcoholic beverages -- stood at ₹58,521 crore in the financial year (FY) 2019-20, according to a report.

According to FICCI Committee Against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy (CAS-CADE) report released on Thursday, two highly regulated and taxed industries, tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, account for nearly 49 % of the overall tax loss to the government even as their total size in illicit trade was much lower than the FMCG industry.

The tax loss across these sectors stood at ₹17,074 crore (FMCG packaged foods), ₹15,262 crore (alcoholic beverages), ₹13,331 crore (tobacco products), ₹9,995 crore (FMCG household and personal goods), and ₹2,859 crore (mobile phones).

Government levies a tax of 58.14% on tobacco products (excluding bidi), while tax on alcoholic beverages, based on the analysis of 14 liquor companies and excise duty paid by them, is in the range of 64-65%.

Hence, tax loss due to illicit trade in these sectors is much more than other sectors which attract taxes between 12-18%.

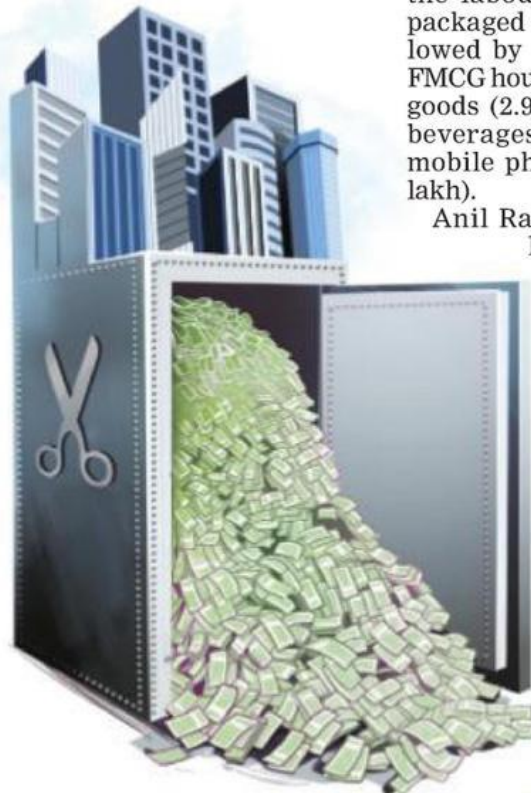
FICCI has estimated that the size of illicit markets in five industries was ₹2,60,094 crore for the year 2019-20, with the FMCG industry — household and personal goods, and packaged foods — together accounting for three-fourth of the total illicit value.

The FMCG packaged foods

industry held the highest share of illicit market at ₹1,42,284 crore, and was followed by FMCG household and personal goods at ₹55,530 crore, alcoholic beverages at ₹23,466 crores, tobacco products at ₹22,930 crore, and mobile phone at ₹15,884 crore

The report further estimates legitimate employment loss of 15.96 lakh due to illicit trade. The maximum number of jobs (7.94 lakh) were lost in the labour-intensive FMCG packaged foods industry, followed by tobacco (3.7 lakh), FMCG household and personal goods (2.989 lakh), alcoholic beverages (0.979 lakh), and mobile phone industry (0.35 lakh).

Anil Rajput, Chairman of FICCI CASCADE, said, "Smuggling is the deadliest form of Illicit trade. Besides causing severe damage to the exchequer, in the form of revenue loss, proliferating terrorism by allowing terror groups to get funds and impacting consumer health and safety, it leads to unemployment by exporting jobs out of the country."

## Involve consumers in detecting fake products: CBIC member

Emphasising on making the consumer aware about illicit and fake products and prevent their sale, Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) member, Sandeep Kumar on Thursday said that enforcement agencies must use digital tools to seize coun-

He suggested that strong action must be taken against such forces.

FICCI President Sanjiv Mehta said that a counter-attack should be launched on fake products.

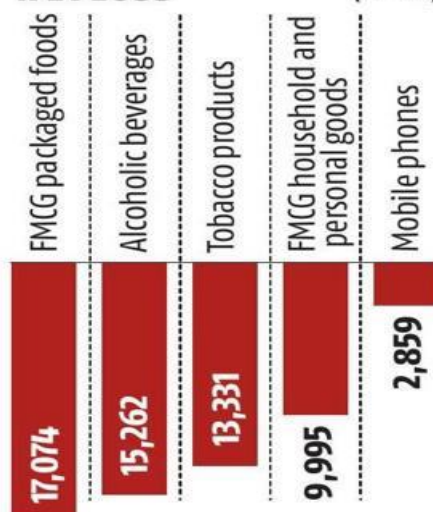

## **Illicit mkts cost ₹58k cr in lost taxes**

**New Delhi:** A study on the threat to the Indian economy from illicit markets — counterfeiting, smuggling and tax evasion — has estimated the value of such goods at Rs 2.6 lakh crore and losses of Rs 58,000 crore in taxes to the exchequer in 2019-20.

The study by TARI (Thought Arbitrage Research Institute), released by Ficci on Thursday, warns policymakers of lack of enforcement and a need for a better police-to-population ratio in the country where the grey market is as high as 34% in the FMCG household/personal goods sector and 25% in the FMCG-packaged goods segment. The annual turnover of the grey market in these two segments is around Rs 2 lakh crore.

However, 49% of the estimated Rs 58,000-crore tax losses in 2019-20 has been from the illicit market in the most regulated tobacco and alcoholic beverages sector. About Rs 13,331-crore tax evasion has been reported from the illicit tobacco market and Rs 15,262-crore loss from the sale of alcoholic beverages in the grey market.

### 'India should adopt innovative, interactive steps aware consumers'

*Illicit trade also deprives govts of revenues for investment in vital public services, Justice Kaul added*

**NEW DELHI:** Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul Judge of Supreme Court of India on Friday said that while every citizen must be made aware of legal provisions to deal with counterfeiting and smuggling, they should also in turn understand the importance of buying genuine goods. "In order to create mass awareness about the ill effects of counterfeiting and smuggling, it is necessary to reach out to all sections of the society. India will have to adopt innovative and interactive measures to reach out to its consumers," he asserted.

Addressing the day-2 of 8th edition of 'MASCRADE 2022', organised by FICCI-CASCADE, Justice Kaul said that it is imperative for all stakeholders to prepare well to meet the emerging threats and challenges associated with counterfeiting and smuggling in consonance with the changing nature of the illegal activity. "This is critical at a time when India is making strong progress to become a manufacturing hub for the world, supporting innovation in every sector and focusing on people-centric development models,"

he added.

Justice Kaul further stated that from smuggling, counterfeiting and tax evasion, to the illegal sale, illicit trade is impacting legitimate economic activity. It also deprives governments of revenues for investment in vital public services, dislocating millions of legitimate jobs and causing irreversible damage to ecosystems and human lives, he added.

Justice Manmohan Sarin, Former Lokayukta, NCT of Delhi, Chief Justice, High Court of Jammu & Kashmir, Judge, High Court Delhi and

Think Tank Member, FICCI CASCADE said that there is enough discretion in the existing laws to carry out the judicial powers for attaining the desired objectives.

FICCI-CASCADE Anti-Counterfeiting and Anti-Smuggling Awards were given to enforcement officers, school children and journalists during the Valedictory session.

Sanjeev Tripathi, Former Chief of RAW and Think Tank Member, FICCI CASCADE also shared his perspective during the valedictory session.

Earlier during the day Dr

Bibek Debroy, Chairman, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, said that as consumers and citizens, we ask the government to do various things, but it actually is up to us how we tackle counterfeits and smuggled goods. "The broader issue is consumer mindset," he added.

If the consumer regards a commodity as something where the after-sale service is unimportant, then it tends to be much more price sensitive as they don't care about the quality, stated Dr Debroy. However, he averred that as systems

become more organised, the importance of the grey market becomes less and less. He also suggested sensitising consumers using vernacular languages.

Narendra K Sabharwal, Chairman, FICCI IP Committee & Former Deputy Director General, WIPO and Think Tank Member, FICCI CASCADE, alluded to various studies, particularly by OECD, that have underscored the enormous impact of counterfeit and pirated products on international trade and noted the figure could be in excess of US\$ 460 billion per year. **MPOST**



# Govt loses ₹58,521-cr tax revenue due to illicit trade

**Illegal market size in 4 key sectors -FMCG, mobile, tobacco and alcohol- pegged at Rs2.60 lakh cr; Estimated employment loss was 7.94 lakh jobs: Report**

THE exchequer is estimated to have lost Rs 58,521 crore in taxes in 2019-20 due to illicit trade in goods in 5 key industries, including FMCG, mobile phone, tobacco products and alcohol, a Ficci report said on Thursday.

The report estimates the size of illicit markets in these industries at a little over Rs2.60 lakh crore for the year 2019-20, with the FMCG industry accounting for 75 per cent of the total illicit value of goods in five key industries.

"The estimated tax loss to the government due to illicit goods in these five key industries is Rs 58,521 crore," said the report titled 'Illicit Markets: A Threat to Our National Interests' by FICCI's Committee Against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy (CASCADE).

The two highly regulated and taxed industries, tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, account for nearly 49 per cent of the overall tax



loss to the government due to illicit markets in these five key industries. The maximum number of jobs (7.94 lakh) were lost due to illicit trade in the FMCG packaged foods industry, followed by tobacco industry (3.7 lakh), FMCG household and personal goods industry (2.989 lakh), alcoholic beverages industry (97,000), and mobile phone industry (35,000). This is followed by alcoholic beverages at Rs 23,466 crore, tobacco products (Rs 22,930 crore) and mobile phones (Rs 15,884 crore).

The report highlights that to deal with the menace of illicit markets in India, addressing the demand and supply gap of legitimate goods, strengthening the domestic manufacturing sector, increasing awareness among consumers, rationalisation of tariffs to reduce tax arbitrage, creation of a conducive environment for innovation and better international coordination and cooperation are some of the way forwards.

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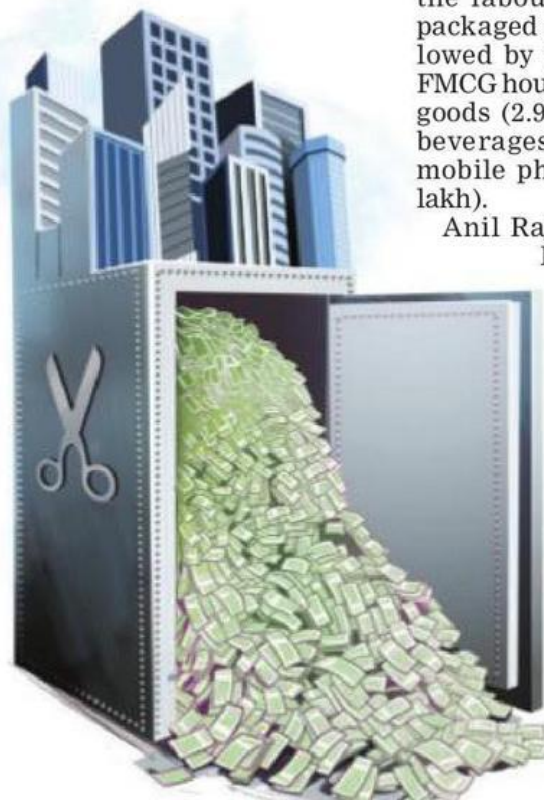

THE exchequer is estimated to have lost Rs 58,521 crore in taxes in 2019-20 due to illicit trade in goods in 5 key industries, including FMCG, mobile phone, tobacco products and alcohol, a Ficci report said on Thursday.

The report estimates the size of illicit markets in these industries at a little over Rs2.60 lakh crore for the year 2019-20, with the FMCG industry accounting for 75 per cent of the total illicit value of goods in five key industries.

"The estimated tax loss to the government due to illicit goods in these five key industries is Rs 58,521 crore," said the report titled 'Illicit Markets: A Threat to Our National Interests' by FICCI's Committee Against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy (CASCADE).

The two highly regulated and taxed industries, tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, account for nearly 49 per cent of the overall tax



loss to the government due to illicit markets in these five key industries. The maximum number of jobs (7.94 lakh) were lost due to illicit trade in the FMCG packaged foods industry, followed by tobacco industry (3.7 lakh), FMCG household and personal goods industry (2.989 lakh), alcoholic beverages industry (97,000), and mobile phone industry (35,000). Of the total illicit market size of Rs2.60 lakh crore, FMCG industry (household and personal goods, packaged foods) constitute over Rs1.97 lakh crore. This is followed by alcoholic beverages at Rs 23,466 crore, tobacco products (Rs 22,930 crore) and mobile phones (Rs 15,884 crore).

The report highlights that to deal with the menace of illicit markets in India, addressing the demand and supply gap of legitimate goods, strengthening the domestic manufacturing sector, increasing awareness among consumers, rationalisation of tariffs to reduce tax arbitrage, creation of a conducive environment for innovation and better international coordination and cooperation are some of the way forwards.

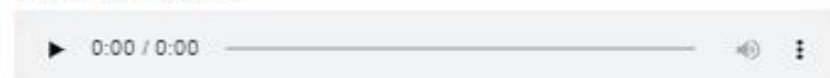

तस्करी व नकली पैकेज्ड फूड के अवैध कारोबार में 2014 से 2020 के दौरान साढ़े छह गुने की वृद्धि हो गई है। इसी दौरान नकली घरेलू सामान के कारोबार में करीब तीन गुना वृद्धि हो गई। कास्केड के सलाहकार व सेंट्रल बोर्ड ऑफ इनडायरेक्ट टैक्सेज एंड कस्टम्स (सीबीआईसी) के पूर्व चेयरमैन पीसी झा ने कहा कि इस रिपोर्ट में शामिल आंकड़े सरकारी स्रोतों से इस्तेमाल किए गए हैं।

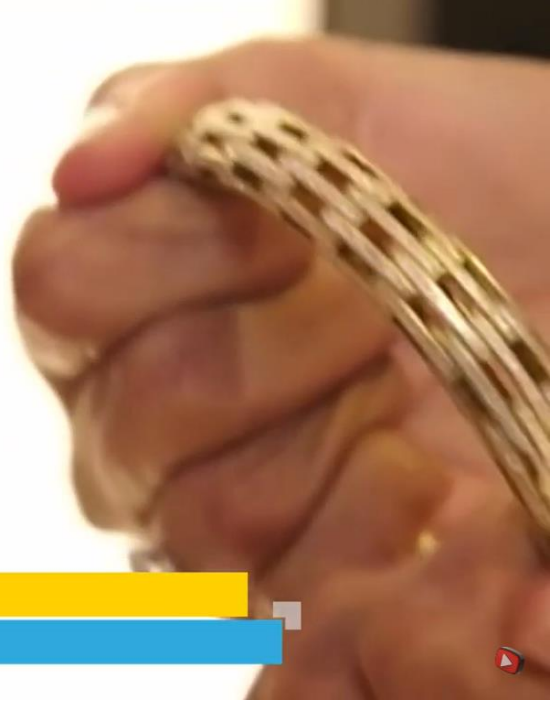

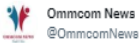

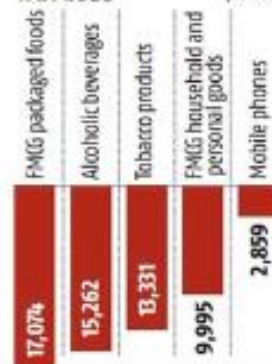
