Tax loss from illicit goods up by ₹25 cr

Chennai: The prevalence of counterfeit products and smuggling in sectors such as mobile phones and fast-moving consumer goods has increased the tax loss to the government by ₹24,607 crore in the last eight years, said P C Jha, former chairman of the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC).

Speaking at the seminar on preventive strategies to combat counterfeiting and smuggling in the city, Jha said that five sectors — mobile phones, household and personal goods, tobacco products, alcoholic beverages and packaged foods — were chosen as most fake and smuggled products fell in those categories.

In smuggling, cigarettes and alcoholic beverages ranked second and third after gold, said Jha. The revenue loss due to illicit trade of tobacco increased from ₹6,239 crore in 2011-12 to ₹13,331 crore in 2019-20.

Food and civil supplies minister R Sakkarapani, who inaugurated the seminar, said businesses should work together to prevent smuggling and fake products in the market.

Minister for Food and Civil Supplies, Consumer Protection and Price Control R. Sakkarapani has appealed to all the stakeholders, including Union and state governments, to wage a war against illicit business and counterfeit products, which is affecting not only the people but also the economy of the country.
