Anti-Smuggling Day: Major gains highlighted

On Anti-Smuggling Day, Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) member Mohan Singh highlighted India's strengthened international enforcement framework, noting that 42 Mutual Customs Cooperation Agreements (MoUs) have been signed and 21 more are under negotiation with key trading partners.

Speaking at the event, Singh said smuggling has become an organised, technology-driven economic crime with direct implications for national security and economic stability.

"Our customs formations and the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence have intensified enforcement efforts significantly. In the first three quarters of the current financial year alone, we have seized around 500 kilograms of gold, nearly 150 million sticks of illicit cigarettes, over

20 metric tonnes of red sanders, approximately 120 kilograms of cocaine, around 50 kilograms of heroin, nearly 350 kilograms of amphetamines and close to 3,700 kilograms of hydroponic cannabis at airports," he said.

Singh added that over 100 wildlife trafficking cases were detected, along with seizures involving dual-use goods, arms, ammunition, drones, and Fake Indian Currency Notes.

The CBIC official emphasised that these measures reflect a comprehensive, technology-driven approach to combating smuggling while safeguarding India's economic and national security interests.

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

We need to target financial flows, logistics enablers and international linkages that sustain these illicit ecosystems,” he said. “Customs acts as the first line of defence at the country’s borders. Through risk-based inspections, advanced cargo screening, non-intrusive examination systems and AI-driven analytics, we are identifying suspicious consignments before they enter the domestic market,” he added.

India Curbs Smuggling: CBIC Deepens Enforcement

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CBIC enhances global enforcement to curb smuggling with 42 agreements. Focus on gold, cigarettes, drugs, wildlife, and tech-driven crime.

New Delhi, Feb 11 (PTI) India has significantly enhanced its global enforcement capabilities to curb transnational smuggling networks through 42 Mutual Customs Cooperation Agreements with major trading partners, while 21 more such pacts are under negotiation, CBIC Member Mohan Kumar Singh said on Wednesday.

Addressing the 5th Edition of Anti-Smuggling Day organised by FICCI CASCADE, Singh said that smuggling has evolved into an organised, technology-driven economic crime with direct implications for national security and economic stability.

"Our customs formations and the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence have intensified enforcement efforts significantly. In the first three quarters of the current financial year alone, we have seized around 500 kilograms of gold, nearly 150 million sticks of illicit cigarettes, approximately 120 kilograms of cocaine, around 50 kilograms of heroin, and close to 3,700 kilograms of hydroponic cannabis at airports," he said.

Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) has also detected over 100 wildlife trafficking cases, along with seizures involving dual-use goods, arms, ammunition, drones and fake Indian currency notes, he said.

He stressed that today's smuggling syndicates are commodity-agnostic and technologically agile, combining traditional concealment techniques with digital anonymity, complex financial layering and cross-border coordination.



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नई दिल्ली में फिक्की कैस्केड के चेयरमैन अनिल राजपूत ने वैश्विक तस्करी के खिलाफ एकजुटता का नया आह्वान किया है। उन्होंने संयुक्त राष्ट्र से 11 फरवरी को 'अंतरराष्ट्रीय तस्करी विरोधी दिवस' घोषित करने की मांग की है, ताकि दुनिया भर में इस खतरे के प्रति जागरूकता फैले और सभी देश मिलकर कार्रवाई करें।

राजपूत ने स्पष्ट शब्दों में कहा कि तस्करी न केवल भारत बल्कि पूरी दुनिया में तेजी से बढ़ रही है। यह अर्थव्यवस्थाओं को कमजोर कर रही है और सुरक्षा को खतरे में डाल रही है। '11 फरवरी को एक वैश्विक दिवस बनाने से तस्करी के खिलाफ सामूहिक आवाज बुलंद होगी,' उन्होंने जोर देकर कहा।

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राष्ट्रीय राजधानी में आयोजित फिक्की कैस्केड के कार्यक्रम में विशेषज्ञों ने भारत की प्रगति पर प्रकाश डाला। देश ने 42 आपसी सीमा शुल्क सहयोग समझौते किए हैं और 21 अन्य पर प्रमुख व्यापारिक भागीदारों के साथ चर्चा जारी है। इससे अंतरराष्ट्रीय स्तर पर तस्करी रोकने का जाल मजबूत हुआ है।

विभिन्न देशों के साथ सीमा शुल्क समझौतों से तस्करी रोकने की क्षमता बढ़ी: सीबीआईसी सदस्य

सीबीआईसी के सदस्य मोहन कुमार सिंह ने हाल ही में घोषित केंद्रीय बजट का हवाला देते हुए कहा कि एआई-आधारित इमेज एनालिटिक्स और प्रमुख बंदरगाहों पर कंटेनर स्कैनिंग के विस्तार से प्रवर्तन क्षमताएं और मजबूत होंगी

केंद्रीय अप्रत्यक्ष कर और सीमा शुल्क बोर्ड (सीबीआईसी) के सदस्य मोहन कुमार सिंह ने बुधवार को कहा कि भारत ने प्रमुख व्यापारिक साझेदारों के साथ 42 पारस्परिक सीमा शुल्क सहयोग समझौतों के माध्यम से अंतरराष्ट्रीय तस्करी नेटवर्क पर अंकुश लगाने के लिए अपनी वैश्विक प्रवर्तन क्षमता को काफी मजबूत किया है। इसके अलावा 21 और ऐसे समझौतों पर बातचीत जारी है। सिंह ने उद्योग मंडल फिक्की-कैस्केड द्वारा आयोजित तस्करी निरोधक दिवस के पांचवें संस्करण को संबोधित करते हुए कहा कि तस्करी एक संगठित, प्रौद्योगिकी-आधारित आर्थिक अपराध में बदल गई है। इसका राष्ट्रीय सुरक्षा और आर्थिक स्थिरता पर सीधा प्रभाव पड़ता है।

उन्होंने कहा, हमारे सीमा शुल्क विभाग और राजस्व खुफिया निदेशालय ने प्रवर्तन प्रयासों को काफी तेज कर दिया है। चालू वित्त वर्ष की पहली तीन तिमाहियों में ही हमने हवाई अड्डों पर लगभग 500 किलोग्राम सोना, लगभग 15 करोड़ अवैध सिगरेट, लगभग 120 किलोग्राम कोकीन, लगभग 50 किलोग्राम हेरोइन और लगभग 3,700 किलोग्राम जलीय भांग जब्त की है। सिंह ने कहा कि केंद्रीय अप्रत्यक्ष कर एवं सीमा शुल्क बोर्ड ने वन्यजीव तस्करी के 100 से अधिक मामलों का पता लगाया है। साथ ही दोहरे उपयोग वाली वस्तुओं, हथियारों, गोला-बारूद, ड्रोन और नकली घरेलू मुद्रा की जब्ती भी की है।

उन्होंने कहा कि तस्करी गिरोह किसी भी वस्तु तक सीमित नहीं हैं और तकनीकी रूप से बेहद सक्षम हैं। वे पारस्परिक उपायों को डिजिटल तकनीक, जटिल विितीय परत और सीमापार समन्वय के साथ जोड़ते हैं। सिंह ने कहा, अधिकारियों को केवल घटना-आधारित जब्ती तक सीमित न रहकर नेटवर्क-आधारित व्यवधान की ओर बढ़ना होगा। हमें उन विितीय प्रवाहों, लॉजिस्टिक सहायकों और अंतरराष्ट्रीय संबंधों को लक्षित करने की आवश्यकता है जो इन अवैध तंत्रों को बनाए रखते हैं।
